Welcome back! Toronto Vintners Club is kicking off the fall with a tasting of Pinot Noir from our local heroes - Ontario wineries that have taken on the "Heartbreak Grape" and were recognized at the 2021 National Wine Awards for their quality. Situated in the center of the world's wine belt, between 41° – 44°N, Southern Ontario possesses the ideal climate and terroir for Pinot Noir. According to Thomas Bachelder, a noted winemaker who has made pinot in four countries spanning three continents, including Burgundy: *"I'd say Ontario is the closest thing to Bourgogne outside of Europe,"* he says. *"There are, of course, similarities that will continue to be highlighted but I think the more interesting aspects of winemaking are revealed in the differences between both regions. One unique element (of Ontario) is the beautiful minerality and pop from the region's limestone-laced soils that, over time, I'm hoping the rest of the world will come to appreciate and covet as much as I do."*

Our tasting will feature eight wines from the two regions that are most notable for their Pinot Noir - Prince Edward County and the Niagara Peninsula. Prince Edward County is located about three hours east of Toronto and is prized for its limestone bedrock and lake effect breezes, lending a savoury and mineral taste to its pinot noir. Its climate tends to produce wines with strong acidity, the kind that unmistakably identifies this specific place on the wine map. In Niagara, the key to producing world-class pinot noir wines stems from the limestone soils and the Niagara Escarpment's relation to Lake Ontario. The distance that the vineyards lie from the lake and the foot of the escarpment determines, in large measure, the character of the wine. This is why the Niagara Peninsula was broken down into ten sub appellations to help further distinguish the region's diverse terroir as it relates to wine.

We will be tasting four wines from each region to discover their unique characteristics. All of these wines won awards at the 2021 National Wine Awards, which is no mean feat, as there were over 2,000 entries from 260 wineries across Canada! Our guest speaker will be Tim Reed-Manessy, Sommelier and Territory Manager with the Living Vine wine import agency.

The event price includes bread, appetizers and, of course, our main wines! We look forward to seeing you!

I could simply sit and inhale these fine aromas all night. On the palate it light to mid-weight, firm, taut and brittle but staying south of austerity, and needing just a couple to years to shave the edges.
